

Easter Activites

I have been informed of the usual Easter events leading up to the holidays and have been giving it much thought. I understand that in the past children walk the streets with staff and parents to parade their bonnets and raise money for the school. I have looked at risks and safeguarding issues related to this event and we are unable to put reasonable control measures in place to lower the risks. Apologies if this is disappointing for you but the decision was based purely on the safety of your children. The Easter bonnet parade will now take place on school premises. Your children can make a bonnet or Easter craft to bring into school on Wednesday next week. The following arrangements will be in place:-

Nusery am - hats and crafts sent into school will be on display for children to see in class. At 11 am parents are invited to come onto the nursery yard to watch the children parade with their hats and crafts.

Nursery pm - as above but parents can come onto the yard at 2.30pm

Reception - as above and parents can come into the yard at 3pm.

Years 1-6 - hats and crafts will be on display in the main hall and parents can come and view from 1.30 til 3pm. Children will parade their hats and crafts on the main school yard at 2.45pm and parents can come along also.

Can I please ask you NOT to take photographs of the children with their hats and crafts on school premises. We have many children who cannot be photographed and this must be respected! School will take photographs of displays and parades with children and these will be checked before being placed on Twitter for you to view. If you want a photograph of your own child please do so outside school to avoid any other pupils being in the background of the picture.

I know that you will understand the difficulties of this in today's society.

<u>Uniform</u>

You will have received a letter about school uniform. It will be very helpful if you can ensure your child comes to school in uniform after Easter. The message we are giving the children is 'teamwork' and teams identify themselves by logos and clothing. Any concerns / worries please contact us at school so we can help. There has been a uniform policy in the school for some time so this is about following school policy and reviewing policies according to pupil voice also. The letter has been based mainly on pupils voice.

If you are worried that your child is falling behind on their learning due to low attendance please come and discuss this with us. They may need extra support due to the time they have lost. How many days has your child been off school and lost hours of learning? 1 day = 5 1/2 hours 2 days = 11 hours 3 days = 16 1/2 hours 4 days = 22 hours 5 days (one week) = 27 1/2 hours

Incidents in school

If your child has been involved in a verbal or physical incident with another child in school and you need information or actions taken, please come into school to report it. First of all you can ask the classteacher and if you are still unhappy then please make an appointment to meet with me. I have received complaints from parents that other parents are approaching them outside school, waiting at the school gate as well as online messaging and texts. Any issues that occur in school need to be resolved in school under governor policies. Parents should not be approaching other parents about their child's behaviours in school. It does upset the parent who is approached. What happens outside school cannot be discussed in school unless it becomes an issue within the school day.
