Open times for parents to visit classes

The purpose of this is for you to see the classroom, take a look at what your child has been doing in class, and the teacher will be there to answer any questions you may have. It is very informal and there will be no need for an appointment. The classroom and the teacher will be available from 3.30pm to 5pm on Oct 22nd. Tea and coffee will also be available in the school hall.
