ANTI BULLYING WEEK (Keeping Safe)

We have made a good start this week and it is likely that topics will continue throughout the year. We placed a focus on "It'll Never Happen To Me". This has two meanings. Your children will be educated enough to ensure they keep themselves safe or they will chose to take risks thinking it will never happen to them. We have taken a strong stance on this during the week, because we are finding that although children know what they should or should not be doing, they seem to get lured into situations that pose risks to themselves, and they are placing themselves in very vulnerable situations. Before they know it they are caught up in situations where they are in trouble!

We are covering elements of bullying, physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect, domestic violence, homophobia, racism, online safety, grooming. There is so much they need to know! Please help us in ensuring your children are safe. Make sure you know where they are, who they are with. Check their phones and tablets for unusual messages. Check the apps they are using. Check the security settings. It's a very dangerous world on line! We have requested support from police to help us ensure that parents are fully aware of current concerns. We are awaiting a response. We would like to hold a parent awareness raising session. Please attend when you see it in the diary. You will be alarmed at what our children are / could be / will be subject to.

Oh no!! They are out and about again! Please check your child's hair and treat if necessary. Staff get them too! It's not pleasant for us either. You can help us eradicate them - make sure you treat and check all the family. Nits will hatch every 20 minutes and the lice will continue to feed on the scalp and lay further eggs. If they are not treated your child will have head lice infestation which can result in bacterial infection and make your child extremely unwell. Make sure you treat and do not keep your child off school. It will be an unauthorised absence. We will accept them being late due to treatment.
